Ben & Bella Burnsafe Superheroes Burn Prevention Storybook Series



Data from the Burns Registry of Australia and New Zealand (BRANZ) reveals that in 2019/20, the most common cause of burn injury amongst paediatric patients was from scalds (52%), followed by contact burns (25%) and flame burns (11%).

The Ben and Bella Burnsafe Superheroes Burn Prevention Education Program created by the Fiona Wood Foundation, is centred around these three major causes of burn injury.

Using a story-telling approach to build engagement in burn prevention education, Ben and Bella help children identify causes of burn injury, burn prevention, and simple first aid for burn injuries through a series of three storybooks.

The storybooks support early burn prevention education for children themselves, as well as their parents and extended families.
